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Dutch treat in Malacca town

MALACCA: Walking along the Stadhuys at busy Jalan Laksamana, it is hard to spot Dutch Harbour café.

But make it a point to look for this outlet which serves mouth-watering finger food in a cosy yet romantic atmosphere overlooking the Malacca River.

With a few tables and chairs placed along the footpath next to the riverbank, customers can sit in the open-air and enjoy the scenery and atmosphere along the old waterway while having their drinks or meals.

Customers can also sit in the mini European-style garden next to the kitchen.

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Dutch Harbour cafe is based on a European-style open coffee shop concept. Friendly staff run it while the service is quiet prompt.

The cafe, co-owned by Azizuddin A. Aziz, 28 and Clifford Hudson, 57, has soft piped-in music playing in the background.

Apart from serving authentic Dutch food, you can also get local delicacies like curry puff and spring rolls and some Italian food like pizza and pasta here.

A must-try is Hagelslag, a common breakfast item among the Dutch, which is buttered bread sprinkled with chocolate rice.

This tasty sandwich, priced at RM3, is available even after breakfast hours.

Guilders, a deep-fried coined-shaped chicken nugget with mashed potatoes stuffing, is another hot favourite here.

Crunchy on the outside and soft in the inside, guilders taste delicious.

It goes well with *koffie verkeerd*, which is made from 20% coffee and 80% milk.

Do try the San Francisco rice, a preparation that see rice grains and orzo (a kind of Italian pasta) mixed and toasted before it is stir-fried with mixed

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vegetables and chicken stock.

This tasty fried rice which has a unique taste and distinctive texture, is not in the least bit oily.

Dutch apple cake, *oliebollen* and chicken croquette are also available if you are looking for some authentic Dutch food.

You can also get Hawaiian chicken pizza, beef pepperoni pizza and lagsana here.

And can quench your thirst with a variety of fresh juices and beer.

The café also has its own unique drink called Madagascar fruit blast, a concentrated tropical fruit puree blended with vanilla cream imported from Madagascar, topped with whipped cream and a small cherry.
